National Justice Reinvestment Program – Round 2

Assessment Cycle 2

Purpose: The Australian Government is inviting applications through an open non-

competitive process to deliver justice reinvestment initiatives.

Funding Provider: Attorney-General's Department

Amount: undisclosed

Closing Date: 10 September 2024 9:00pm (ACT Local Time)

Assessment Cycle 2 is open from 10 May 2024 to 10 September 2024.

Funding is available from 2024-25 to 2026-27 for place-based community-led justice reinvestment initiatives. The National Justice Reinvestment Program is an ongoing program beyond 2026-27.

The objective of this grant opportunity is to:

- Support the development and delivery of community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander-led justice reinvestment initiatives across Australia, by supporting:
 - The development, implementation, and evaluation of local justice reinvestment strategies and activities
 - Local project teams and leadership structures to undertake the work of developing, implementing and evaluating justice reinvestment strategies

The intended outcomes of this grant opportunity are:

- Improving justice outcomes and reducing contact with the criminal justice system and incarceration of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander adults and young people, in line with Closing the Gap Targets 10 and 11
- Contributing to systemic reform of government systems that intersect with the justice system
- Contributing to building a strong and sustainable Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community-controlled sector delivering high quality services to meet the needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people across the country

Eligibility:

The National Justice Reinvestment Program draws upon the strength and knowledge of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

Urban Precincts and Partnerships Program

Purpose: Urban Precincts and Partnerships is a funding program for projects which transform urban precincts through precinct planning or the delivery for infrastructure. Partnerships that bring together government, business and community are encouraged to apply.

Funding Provider: Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Local Government.

Amount: Stream one: up to \$5 million

Stream two: up to \$50 million

Closing Date: ongoing - projects will be batched at least twice a year for assessment.

STREAM ONE:

The urban Precincts and Partnerships Program – Stream One gives partnerships up to \$5 million in funding to develop a precinct idea through to investment-ready stage.

Who is this for?

Australian local, state and territory government agencies or bodies, incorporated not-for-profit organisations, and urban universities.

What do you get?

Funding of \$500,000 to \$5 million, to cover up to 100% of eligible expenditure.

STREAM TWO:

The urban Precincts and Partnerships Program – Stream Two gives partnerships up to \$50 million in funding to deliver elements of a precinct.

Who is this for?

Australian local, state and territory government agencies or bodies, incorporated not-for-profit organisations, and universities.

What do you get?

Funding of \$5 million to \$50 million, to cover up to 100% of eligible expenditure.

Lord Mayor's Safer Suburbs Grants

Purpose: The Lord Mayor's Safer Suburbs Grants provides funding to support

projects that strengthen security for Council Community Leased Facilities.

Funding Provider: Brisbane City Council

Amount: up to \$10,000

Closing Date: 16th September 2024

Examples of eligible projects include:

installation of:

CCTV cameras (new and upgraded)

NOTE: Professional advice should be sought when selecting the most suitable CCTV cameras for provision of effective security benefit

alarm systems

new locks

security screens and fencing

engagement of patrol services

maintenance to existing security systems

graffiti prevention, removal and management

improved external lighting

community safety signage.

All applications are to be submitted via SmartyGrants. This online application system will allow applicants to save, develop and print out applications before they are submitted. Supporting material can be attached to the online application.

Queensland Arts Showcase Program

Purpose:

Funding Provider: Attorney-General's Department

Amount: Up to \$70,000 - 1 year projects

Up to \$150,000 – 2 year projects

Up to \$60,000 - full-time industry placement Up to \$10,000 for composer commissioning

Closing Date: 9th September 2024

The Queensland Arts Showcase Program (QASP) is focused on celebrating Queensland's artists and stories, ensuring Queenslanders' access to high quality experiences and growing Queensland's cultural reputation.

The Fund supports applications from individuals and organisations for projects and programs at different stages of development and across multiple stages from creative development through to production, presentation, and distribution. For example, you can apply for just the creative development stage of a new work or apply to fund the project from its early stages through to a tour of the finished work.

The fund will also support costs towards artistic collaboration with a nationally or internationally significant artist or company for an outcome in Queensland. In addition, applicants have the options to apply for additional funding towards an industry placement as part of the project, and/or the fees for the commissioning of new live or recorded music as part of your project.

Touring Queensland Fund

Purpose: The Touring Queensland Fund focuses on supporting regional

community access to quality arts and cultural events and products.

Funding Provider: Arts Queensland

Amount: Up to \$150,000 - Multi-year touring

Up to \$100,000 - Single year touring

Closing Date: 30th September 2024

This grant supports arts presenters and producers in the delivery of performing arts, visual arts, contemporary music gigs, and cultural heritage touring activity. This fund has 2 streams:

Single year and single tour funding for single tours and touring programs including schools touring (within a 12-month period) and single tours to present arts products and experiences across Queensland touring circuits or regions.

Multi-year touring funding for touring programs that are not dedicated schools touring within a 2-year period (with the option to extend funding agreements for a third year of programs) that enhance community cultural calendars and grow audiences for Queensland artists and arts organisations across or within regions.

Funding will support tours within and between regions, touring from Brisbane to regional Queensland locations, and tours from regionally based companies to Brisbane.

First Nations Commissioning Fund

Purpose: The First Nations Commissioning Fund is focused on investing in opportunities that share First Nations stories and cultural knowledge and elevate awareness of Queensland's exceptional First Nations arts and cultural products and experiences.

Funding Provider: Arts Queensland

Amount: Up to \$70,000 - one-year projects

Up to \$150,000 - two-year projects

Closing Date: 17th March 2025

The First Nations Commissioning Fund supports the development and presentation of new work and cultural programs by individual First Nations artists, arts workers collectives and organisations. The fund strengthens skills development and provide new employment opportunities for First Nations artists and arts workers and grows a pipeline of high-quality First Nations arts, cultural products, and experiences.

Performing Arts Market Development Fund

Purpose: The Fund will support interstate and overseas opportunities that grow Queensland's cultural economy, increase exposure, facilitate business and career growth, and expand markets and export revenue potential for Queensland-based musicians, performing artists and organisations.

Funding Provider: Arts Queensland

Amount: Up to \$80,000 Closing Date: Always open

The Fund:

- Supports attendance and participation in national and international events and showcases that fast-track profile building, grow new networks and connections, and drive career sustainability and economic outcomes through new export markets.
- Generates national and international sales and touring revenue opportunities for Queensland-based artists and arts workers by attending major industry markets and events.
- Enhances skills, professional practice, national and international connections to increase exposure and strengthen the reputation of Queensland's talented music and performing arts sector.

The Fund supports market exposure and development opportunities for individuals or groups including:

- enabling Queensland-based artists' and arts workers' participation in interstate and overseas buyers' marketplaces
- extension of scope/scale of market activity showcasing
- attending key interstate and overseas market events to grow commissioning and presentation opportunities for Queensland artists.

First Nations Arts Business Grants

Purpose: First Nations Arts Business Grants focus on strengthening business skills and capacity of First Nations artists, arts workers and arts and cultural organisations.

Funding Provider: Arts Queensland Amount: One-off grant of up to \$10,000

Closing Date: Always open

One-off grant of up to \$10,000 (excluding GST) are available to fund the purchase of the following eligible services:

- strategic and business planning
- governance planning and related training
- · data and digital platforms and related training
- financial processes including e-commerce and related training
- human resources advice including succession planning.

Quick Response Grants

Purpose: Quick Response Grants aim to support small arts or cultural projects that cannot be funded by other means because of their nature or timing.

Funding Provider: Australia Government Regional Arts Fund, Flying Arts Alliance

Amount: Up to \$3000 for individuals
Up to \$5000 for organisations

Closing Date: Always open

This grant helps to facilitate the delivery of time-sensetive arts and cultural opportunities. For example, you may wish to attend a workshop or complete a project within a certain time frame and cannot access appropriate funding through any other means. Please note that Quick Response grants are competitive, and as part of your application you will need to detail why your project cannot be funded through other means. This type of grant would also suit individual professional development

Australian Cultural Fund (ACF)

Purpose: Through the ACF, artists upload their project, start their fundraising campaign and invite art lovers and supporters to donate with 100% of donations going directly towards artists' creative projects.

Funding Provider: Creative Australia

Amount: -

Closing Date: Always open

The Australian Cultural Fund (ACF) is a fundraising platform for Australian artists.

Through the ACF you can offer tax deductibility to your donors. The ACF has helped raise millions of dollars for Australian artists, enabling a wide range of projects to come to life and offering support to Australia's cultural sector.

National Cultural Heritage Account

Purpose: The National Cultural Heritage Account is a grant program that assists Australian cultural organisations to acquire significant cultural heritage objects that they could not otherwise afford.

Funding Provider: Office for the Arts

Amount: -

Closing Date: Always open

The National Cultural Heritage Account helps to retain and protect Australia's cultural heritage for future generations and provide public access to important objects that tell a story about our cultural identity. Australian cultural organisations that can care for and provide permanent public access to Australian protected objects have a priority for funding.

Cultural Gifts Program

Purpose: The Cultural Gifts Program offers tax incentives to encourage people to donate cultural items to public art galleries, museums, libraries and archives in Australia.

Funding Provider: Office for the Arts

Amount: -

Closing Date: Always open

If you have an item recognised as important to Australia's culture you can donate it and receive a tax deduction. Donations include paintings, books, sculptures, installations, new media, manuscripts, personal papers, jewellery, ceramics, technological or scientific collections.

International Finance Fund

Purpose: The International Finance fund provides support to Australian projects

with a very high level of global appeal. Funding Provider: Screen Australia

Amount: \$5000 to \$20,000 Closing Date: Always open

This fund provides support to Australian projects with international potential to assist them to develop pitching materials and strategy, in order to best attract international partnerships and finance in the current market.

It is open to long form drama and documentary projects on any platform which are market ready, have undergone a successful development process and can demonstrate development funding from an arm's length commercial partner.

International Pitching Events and Talent Labs

Purpose: International Pitching Events and Talent Labs provides support to producers selected for competitive overseas pitching events

Funding Provider: Screen Australia

Amount: \$5000 to \$20,000 Closing Date: Always open

This initiative supports producers in overseas pitching events in order for them to secure finance, production and marketplace partners for Australian projects, or for key creatives invited to attend premium overseas talent labs to enable professional development and to build international industry networks.

International Marketing Support: Festivals and Awards

Purpose: For the promotion of Australian content and talent at the key international

festivals and awards events

Funding Provider: Screen Australia

Amount: \$20,000 for feature films and television series and \$10,000 for short films

Closing Date: Six weeks in advance of the event

This initiative provides for the enabling the enhancement of international marketing strategies in conjunction with other partners.

Limited funding to acknowledge the importance of global strategies for new titles, restricted to their world or international premiere and planned related sales and marketing activities at significant industry events.

P&A Plus

Purpose: This program is designed to enhance the distribution and marketing of quality Australian films across traditional and alternative release platforms.

Funding Provider: Screen Australia

Amount: -

Closing Date: Always open

Funding can be sought to support the traditional theatrical Australian and New Zealand release of completed feature films that have an established local distributor attached, or for alternative release campaigns in certain circumstances.

Industry Growth Program

Purpose: The program supports innovative SMEs undertaking commercialisation or growth projects that will build Australian capabilities in priority areas for the National Reconstruction Fund (NRF).

Funding Provider: Department of Industry, Science and Resources

Amount: \$50,000 to \$5 million Closing Date: undisclosed

Grants for the Industry Growth Program (IGP) are now open for Australian startups and innovative SMEs who want to scale up their business.

There are two matched funding grant opportunities for startups and SMEs that fall under the NRF priority areas:

- Early-Stage Commercialisation Grants from \$50,000 to \$250,000 to help establish the commercial viability of an innovative product, process or service.
- Commercialisation and Growth Grants from \$100,000 to \$5 million to help push ideas from prototyping through to market readiness stages. Grants will help develop strategies for entry to market and scaling up into national and international markets.

Grant funding through these programs is matched with the IGP's specialised advice and mentoring program.

After receiving advisory services and a commercialisation and growth report under the Industry Growth Program, eligible businesses can choose to apply for these grant opportunities.

Not all businesses will go on to apply for funding, and matched grant funding will be awarded to those most meritorious in their applications.

Export Market Development Grants (EMDG)

Purpose: The Export Market Development Grants (EMDG) program helps

Australian businesses grow their exports in international markets.

Funding Provider: Department of Trade and Tourism

Amount: Tier 1: \$20,000 - \$30,000

Tier 2: \$20,000 - \$50,000 Tier 3: \$20,000 - \$80,000 Tier 4: up to \$50,000

2024 Partnerships for culturally safe cancer care grant program

Purpose: Cancer Australia is inviting partnerships between cancer services and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community controlled organisations to apply for funding under the *Partnerships for culturally safe cancer care* grant program.

Funding Provider: Cancer Australia

Amount: Up to \$1 million available for each partnership.

Closing Date: 23rd October 2024

Addressing equity and cultural safety issues in mainstream health services where specialist cancer care is delivered will support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to access high quality treatment and experience better cancer outcomes.

The grant program aims to support implementation of innovative approaches to accelerate the delivery of culturally safe, accessible, and responsive cancer care for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

To apply for the grant, applicants will need to demonstrate a partnership between a cancer service and at least one Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander community-controlled organisation.

Eligible organisations include:

- Cancer services that support the diagnosis, management, and treatment of people with cancer, their families, and communities.
- Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander community-controlled organisations that provide primary and supportive care to support the holistic needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and communities
- Not-for-profit organisations that support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people affected by cancer.
